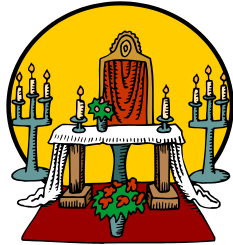

Please can you ensure that you contact the school office before 9am on the first day of absence and every day thereafter if your child is not well enough to attend to school.

If your child has vomited or diarrhoea, please ensure that he/she remain at home for 48 hours after the last episode before returning to school.



We have recently received a complaint from one of our neighbours that parents' vehicles are blocking drives during drop off and pick up times and residents are unable to exit their property. It has therefore been necessary for us to contact the local authority who advised that it is a police issue. Vehicles can be removed if they are considered a danger or causing an obstruction. The council will be sending out a vehicle fitted with ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) which is able to photograph vehicles parked in inappropriate or dangerous positions. Appropriate action will be taken against their owners.

Please note that from 31st January for 4 days, Hitchin Road is closed and school can only be accessed from the direction of Sandy. Considerable delays may therefore be inevitable. This may be an ideal opportunity for you to find an alternative parking space and walk a bit further to school (or leave the car at home and walk all the way).

If you are able to walk your children to school, this is obviously the best option for all involved, however if this is not possible for you, **please be considerate of our neighbours at all times.**
